5. West Allis West Milwaukee Community Health Improvement Plan

Melissa Hanson from the West Allis Health Department shared with the group that every five years the community conducts the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Health Assessment (CHA) and the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP). In 2015, data was compiled to complete the most recent community health assessment. A meeting was then held in May 2016 to engage community leaders and stakeholders to review and discuss this community specific data in order to determine the most pressing community concerns to be addressed over the next five years. The three priorities chosen are:

1. Mental Health
2. Substance Abuse and Addiction
3. Healthy Lifestyle

Small community action teams were then formed to address each of these priorities and work with existing community workgroups to develop objectives, strategies and work plans to address these priorities and set goals for completion by 2020.

The Coalition chaired the substance abuse prevention action team to develop a plan that aligns well with many of the Coalition goals and initiatives. The final framework and work plan will be shared at a future meeting.

Dave Bandomir and Joanie Luedke from the WAWM Heroin/Opiate Task Force shared information about the If Only event held at Hale and the Teen Replica Room. The Teen Replica Room will debut on December 6 at 3:00 pm in the Survive Alive House and is available for guided tours for ages 21 and over. Registration is available on survey monkey.

22. Underage alcohol abuse – local issues

Lt. Jessica Johnson and Corporal Rod Nelson of the West Allis Police Department shared the following information about from this past year:

- Programs included Senior Safety Talks, foot patrols that distributed medication drop-off locations, Knock and Talks and drug take back events.
 - Tobacco compliance checks were done 4 times – 2 retailers in September were not compliant
 - Alcohol compliance checks were done in September – all 11 were compliant
 - Trends for youth still tend to be alcohol and tobacco substance abuse
- Lt. Brian Chic from the West Milwaukee Police Department shared the following information from this past year:
- Random compliance checks were conducted at bars
 - 31 arrests for possession of marijuana were made
 - 6 were also issued loitering or other tickets

23. West Allis Fire Department – local issues

Lt. Dave Bandomir from the West Allis Fire Department gave an update on the Integrated Healthcare Program.

- 8 community paramedics were trained at UWM
- Worked with high utilizer group
 - 86% decrease in 911 transport rate
 - 71% change in Emergency Department utilization
 - 100% satisfaction rate
 - Reduction in readmission rates at Aurora West Allis
- Opioid use
 - Shows increase in deaths
 - Narcan use
 - 2015 – 91
 - 2016 – 99 so far this year (month and a half to go)

Lt. Bandomir also offered hands only CPR training and AED familiarization after the meeting.
