# 2nd Annual Parent Safety Night Successful

The West Allis-West Milwaukee School District hosted its **2nd Annual Parent Safety Night on Monday, May 7, 2012 at 7:00 pm in the West Allis Nathan Hale High School Auditorium.** Working in collaboration, the West Allis Police Department, the West Allis Fire Department, the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District, and the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition presented information to parents about the dangers of prescription medications, illegal drugs, alcohol, and other substances. A panel made up of school district personnel, a parent, representatives from the West Allis Police and Fire Departments, as well as a licensed psychotherapist discussed the problems of substance use and abuse. The event was meant to inform parents of what to look for, and give them resources if they suspect their son or daughter may be using illegal drugs. This program has become an annual event hosted by West Allis Central and Nathan Hale High Schools in alternating years. Next fall West Allis Nathan Hale High School will host an event for students and their parents.

Approximately 50 people were in attendance. Parents from all West Allis-West Milwaukee intermediate and high schools were invited to attend. The event was meant to be a proactive intervention to promote safe behaviors during the upcoming high school proms, graduation celebrations, and summer activities. West Allis Central's prom is Saturday, May 12th, and Nathan Hale's prom is Saturday, May 19th. Panelists at the event included Kellie Robinson, a mother who lost her son to a prescription drug overdose; Lt. Chad Evenson, Lt. Christopher Marx, Lt. Jay Scharfenberg; health teacher, Jon Nelson; assistant principal, Paul Kurth; and licensed psychotherapist, Dennis Wolf. District ATODA Coordinator, Beth Heflin lead the panel discussion. Parents had the opportunity to ask the panelists questions, and the event was well received by those who attended.

We hope the event increased awareness and help parents have those crucial conversations with their daughters/sons to make positive life choices. Future events will include a student/parent event in the fall, assemblies at each high school in the winter, and a parents only event in the spring. We thank all of the panelists, the West Allis Police and Fire Departments, Tammy Molter of the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition, and the West Allis School District for planning and organizing the event.
