# 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Safe and Sober Family Night Successful

The West Allis-West Milwaukee School District hosted its 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Safe and Sober Family Night on Monday, September 17, 2012 at 7:00 pm in the Nathan Hale High School Auditorium. Working in collaboration, the West Allis Police Department, the West Allis-West Milwaukee School District, the West Allis Fire Department and the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition presented information to parents and students on making positive choices. The panel discussion centered around the question, "How has alcohol affected you professionally or personally?" and informed families about the dangers of drinking and driving, current trends in teenage substance use, and how to keep our students safe. This program has become an annual event hosted by West Allis Central and Nathan Hale High Schools in alternating years. Next fall West Allis Central High School will host the event.

Approximately 225 people were in attendance. Of those, 100 were parents, and 125 were

students from both Central and Nathan Hale High Schools. The event was meant to be a proactive intervention to promote safe behaviors during the upcoming high school homecomings, winter formals, proms, and graduation celebrations. Attendees passed by a WAPD squad car that was involved in an accident with a drunk driver over the summer in order to get into the building.





Panelists at the event included Lt. Chad Evenson and Officer Andrew Matter, WAPD; Lt. Jay Scharfenberg, WAFD; Darrell Woodard, Dean of Students at West Allis Nathan Hale High School; and community members Jenny Kinney and Tyler Lambert. The event concluded with parents and their daughter/son signing a family pledge to one another. Over 120 pledges were distributed and signed.

Students who attended the family night with their parents/guardians received a \$10 voucher, which can be used toward one event (homecoming, winter formal, or prom).

Over \$500 in gift certificates and prizes were donated by local businesses. Prizes were given away at the end of the program, which included discounts at local hair/nail/tanning salons and florists. We hope the event increased awareness and will help parents have those crucial conversations with their daughter/son to make positive life choices. Future events will include assemblies at each high school in the winter, and a parents only event in the spring.
