6th Annual Safe and Sober Fall Family Night



Over 225 students and their parents attended the 6th Annual Safe and Sober program that was held March 20th at West Allis Central High School. The topic for the program was Tyler's Legacy: The Impact of Substance Abuse on the Family presented by Raeanna Johnson Miss Wisconsin 2014. Tyler's Legacy is dedicated to promoting awareness about the impact of substance abuse and addiction on families. Consequences were presented by Corporal Rod Nelson from West Allis Police Department and Paul Bursi from West Allis Central High School.

Gift certificates from eight local businesses, including restaurants, hair and nail salons, florists and tanning salons were raffled at the end of the program. Students who attended the family night with their parents/guardians received a \$10 voucher, which can be used toward one event (homecoming, winter formal, or prom).

Youth members from the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition presented information about the Family Pledge that was then signed by over 90 families in attendance. The youth also launched the Parents Who Host, Lose the Most campaign. The yard signs, posters and window clings form Parents Who Host are a reminder for parents not to hold underage drinking parties and for youth to have a safe and sober homecoming and school year
