The 7th Annual Safe and Sober Spring Family Night was held on April 11, 2016 at Nathan Hale High School with about 200 parents and students attending. Working in collaboration with the West Milwaukee Police Department, the West Allis West Milwaukee School District and the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition information was shared for parents and students on making positive choices and having a safe prom. The speakers for the program included Nic Bur

from the WAWM School District who had an interactive presentation about communication and communication challenges between parents and youth. The group was then divided into parents and youth, with the parents learning about ways to keep youth safe and tips for parents from Officer Sean Patyk of the West Milwaukee Police Department. The youth went to the cafeteria to learn about dignity and staying true to themselves at prom and in their future from Katie Mac Grath and Sabley Sabine from the WAWM School District.



Youth members from the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition presented information about the Family Pledge that was then signed by the over 100 families in attendance. The youth also launched the Parents Who Host, Lose the Most campaign. The yard signs, posters and window clings form Parents Who Host are a reminder for parents not to hold underage drinking parties and for youth to have a safe and sober prom, graduation and summer.



Gift certificates from eight local businesses, including restaurants, hair and nail salons, florists and tanning salons were raffled at the end of the program. Students who attended the family night with their parents/guardians received a \$10 voucher, which can be used toward one event (homecoming, winter formal, or prom).
