

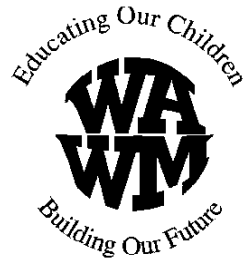
5th Annual Safe and Sober Family Night

The 5th Annual Safe and Sober Family Night was held September 16th at West Allis Central High School. The topic was internet safety. Eric Swatzkowski from the WI Department of Justice spoke about cyber bullying, social networking, sexting, current trends in exploitation and obtaining drugs and alcohol on the internet and other digital safety issues. He offered parents tips and suggestions on monitoring computer use and websites that can assist parents in keeping youth safe. Dan Solorzano, from West Allis Central High School, and Sgt. Jeritt Mees, from the West Allis Police Department and liaison office for Central, presented about the consequences.

Over 200 students from Central and Nathan Hale High School, and their parents attended the program. Students who attended the family night with their parents/guardians received a \$10 voucher, which can be used toward one event (homecoming, winter formal, or prom). Gift certificates from local businesses including florists, restaurants, hair and nail salons and tanning salons were raffled at the end of the program.

Youth members from the West Allis-West Milwaukee Community Coalition presented information about the Family Pledge that was then signed by over 100 families in attendance. The youth also launched the Parents Who Host, Lose the Most campaign. A reminder for parents not to hold underage drinking parties and for youth to have a safe and sober homecoming and school year.

The Stick will not only recover deleted data but download all the contents of the phone including dynamic text (words typed by the user), images sent via text, internet history.



Porn Detection Stick will help you quickly investigate your computer and help you determine if pornographic images are present...intentional or accidental



IF you permit your kids to have a **smart phone**, this product alerts a subscriber “when unknown people try to call, email or text message your child. Exceptional activities are logged, allowing you to view, assess and take action on questionable contacts;” also, can deactivate camera, block apps, and/or inappropriate sites or content on the web.
